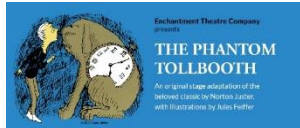

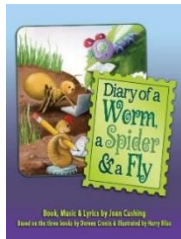

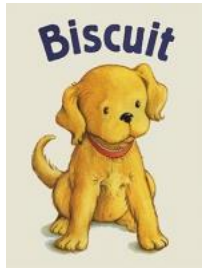
DIARY OF A WORM, A SPIDER & A FLY

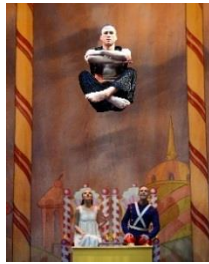
